





#### **Commitment to Truth and Reconciliation**

### **Kootenay Clean Energy Transition**



Tri-regional initiative to prepare and position the Kootenays for a clean energy transition

Key objectives:

- Reduce community GHG emissions targeting the two highest emitting sectors (heating & cooling of buildings and transportation)
- Better understand and address key barriers
- Provide local capacity building opportunities



## Accelerate Kootenays 2.0





Kootenays charging ahead in support of electric vehicle travel

The Kootenays are quickly becoming one of the most connected rural regions in Canada for electric vehicle (EV) travel.



**Goal:** Increase charging infrastructure across the Kootenay and Boundary regions to increase levels of EV travel and EV adoption


**Objective:** Install 90 Level 2 Chargers, 6-8 Level 3 DCFC (CEA's role is granting agency – 50% of funding)

- RDCK 3 applicants (6 Level 2)
- RDEK 9 application (24 Level 2, 2 Level 3)
- RDKB 3 applicants (4 Level 2, 2 Level 3)


### Context

What does climate communications research show is the problem?

#### **CLIMATE CHANGE IS A CRISIS**

Global warming is a major crisis (Research Co. 2020)	62%	
In the long term, climate change is as serious a crisis as COVID-19 is (Ipsos 2020)	64%	
Climate change is extremely serious or serious (Abacus 2020)		<b>76</b> %

### Context



45% agree climate change is a real problem but aren't engaged yet. As a result, public support is often unreliable.

# The Opportunity

Use what you are already doing to talk about the pathway we have to address climate change and prepare for impacts


- 1. Connect with local identity, context and local leadership
- 2. Place people at the centre and choose messengers who reflect local identity
- 3. Lead with values that reflect community diversity
- 4. Build on positive stories
- 5. Recognize the efforts people are already making
- 6. Talk about action what can people DO –and solution
- 7. Use relevant, local images that are relatable


